

2022 was the year of abundance. As we talked about at the gala, there are so many seasons that people, ministries and communities endure: times of famine, times of plenty, times of strife, times of prosperity.

God graciously, mercifully, wonderfully humbled us through the outpouring of financial support this year. With a record number of patients walking through our doors and the looming opening of a third clinic, this year could have been one of hardships and sacrifice. Instead, a flood of generosity has enabled us to continue on our quest of loving women and their families well.

Here's a quick snapshot of our two main fundraisers during this past year:

BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN

Our annual "official" baby bottle campaign runs from Mother's Day through Father's Day, but baby bottles are distributed through the community year-round. This was, without a doubt, the most financially successful baby bottle campaign to date. In fact, it nearly doubles the amount of the next highest total from 2019 (\$43,075)!

AMOUNT RAISED: \$80,127.74

CHOOSE LIFE GALA

This year was the 32nd annual Choose Life Gala, which quickly transformed into an evening of praise for God's faithfulness through the generations. We had a recordnumber of attendees (more than 600 people present!) and raised one-third of the funds needed for our new clinic! What a blessing you are, dear friends!

when the village is MISSING

We've all heard the phrase: "It takes a village." It's well known that having children, loving children, raising children... it's hard. There are sleepless nights, fussy babies, sudden high fevers, and inexplicable anxiety. Parents need

community to lean on for support, encouragement and help.

So what happens when a pregnant woman finds herself without a reliable "village," without a team of support to rally around her? What if the only words she heard were that of death?

Enter abortion

Carrie came into her pregnancy test appointment still reeling with trauma from a previous abortion a year prior. Her then-boyfriend and her father pressured her into the abortion, and she was left to pick up the pieces alone. The abortion took place in her bathroom, where she suffered painfully alone, bleeding, and vomiting. But the abortion was not "complete," and it took two months of clinic visits to finish the procedure.

Since then, she has been plagued with depression and anxiety, which was magnified after finding out she is pregnant again. This time, Carrie is determined to choose life.

Carrie is someone who needs a village that will speak words of life and grace into her. Please be praying for her and that God would fill her life with support and encouragement. Pray she

would be met with true peace that is found only in the Holy Spirit.

Pray that we, as a God-loving community, would rally to become a village for parents and for those who can see no path forward with a pregnancy amidst their existing struggles.



The return of IN-PERSON CLASSES

While the use of online pre- and postnatal classes has been amazingly helpful for allowing more women to receive education

and support, we are thrilled to begin building some deeper connections with new in-person classes!



CHILDBIRTH CLASSES

Dianne and Sue lead our quarterly childbirth preparation classes (graciously held at Orangeburg Baptist Church). Their goal as childbirth educators is to help women feel prepared and empowered to have the birth they choose (be it medicated, "natural," C-section, etc). They seek to create a relationship of trust using evidence-based research and, most importantly, the love of Jesus!

In November, the nurses tested a couple of new ultrasound machines as they continue the process of preparing to open this new clinic. They booked a few ultrasound models who were willing to let the nurses more or less play with the equipment: How are the views? Are the images clear? Is the functionality easy to learn and intuitive?

Ultimately, the nurses loved the GE Voluson S8 and what it can offer not just us, but our patients!



The last city permit has finally cleared, and plumbing and concrete work are set to begin! In the meantime, we are making the large purchases needed to get the clinic up and running, such as the A/C units, furniture and two ultrasound machines!
